We **RANK 12TH** for health factors (health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment).

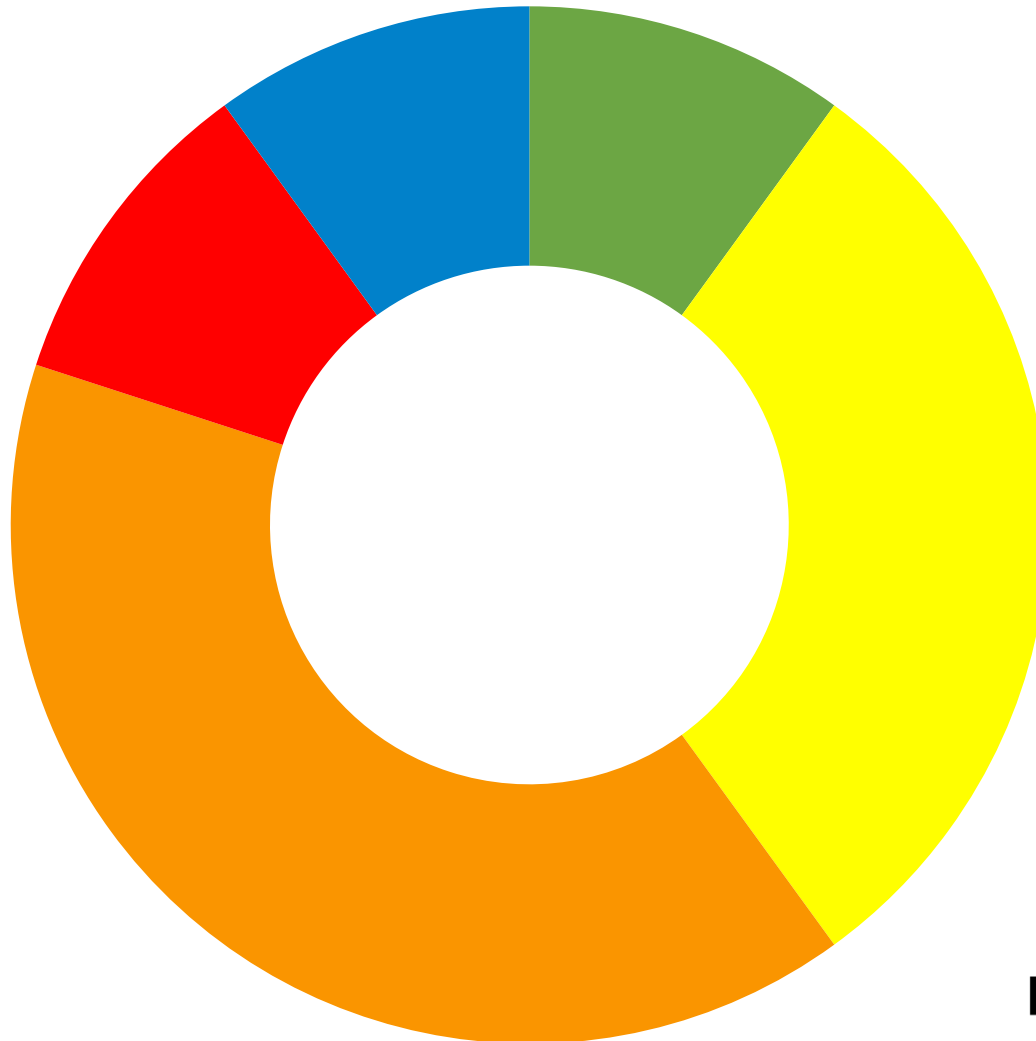

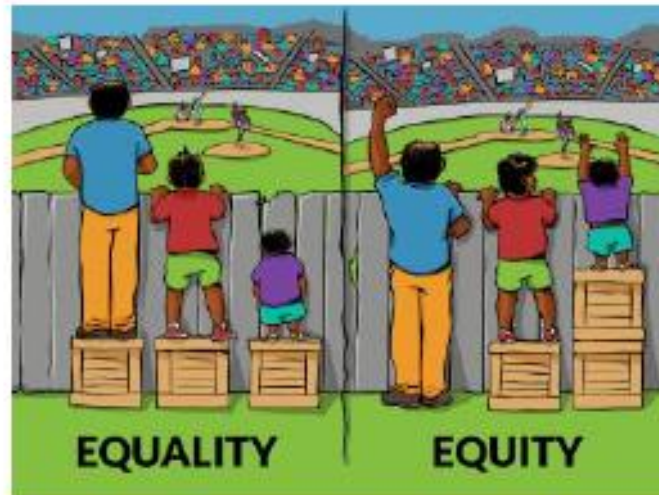
