- **White Bird:** Front Rooms Resource Center; New hours: 9am to 5pm; 541-342-4357
 - People will only be allowed in the building for limited services
- **Assurance Wireless: Lifeline Cell Phone Service Provider:** free phone and data to qualifying low income families. Unlimited Domestic Calling & Texting plus an extra 6GB* Data through 5/20/2020

COMPUTER ACCESS

- Parents can utilize computers sent home with students during distance learning.
- **Department of Human Services, Self Sufficiency Program:** Keeping local Offices open during pandemic to serve people who do not have access to the Internet; only a few computers available at a time to maintain required 6 ft distance; lobbies open M-F 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. unless otherwise noted.
